
Dear All.

Flu and Pneumococcal vaccinations will commence this Autumn. Patients will be invited to an appointment either by text or by telephone. Those that are eligible for both Pneumococcal and Flu will be informed and both vaccines will be administered at the appointment.

Clinics are expected to start on Saturday 17th September. From Tuesday 6th September appointments can be booked over the phone after 11 am, through the NHS App, or via Systmonline access.



Covid Booster vaccinations are being delivered through the National Booking service and **not at the Surgery**. The dual vaccine "Spikevax bivalent Original/Omicron" will be used - designed to tackle both the original Covid virus and Omicron variant.

Starting during the week of 5th September, NHS staff will begin vaccinating care home residents and people who are housebound. The National Booking Service will also open that week ahead of the wider rollout, due to start on the 12th September, with the NHS inviting those who are most susceptible to serious illness from COVID-19 and those aged 75 and over to book an appointment from that week. As with previous campaigns, the oldest and most vulnerable will be called forward first, with people able to book in online or through 119 as long as it has been three months since their last dose. New Telephone System

A new telephone system called Surgery Connect is planned to be installed at the Medical Centre over the next few months. This will give more options for callers and should give much improved communication with the Medical Centre.

One of the main features is that there will be an optional call back facility to save callers' time holding on. Others include the ability for patients to self-manage their appointments, so they can check, book and cancel appointments using speech recognition, cutting the need to talk to practice staff directly. Text confirmation will automatically send appointment details to mobile callers and a Confirm and Remind function will automatically alert patients to the details of their appointment, helping to cut down on missed appointments. Also, call handlers will be able to see callers' medical records, so this will save time.



High blood pressure, or hypertension, rarely has noticeable symptoms. But if untreated, it increases your risk of serious problems such as heart attacks and strokes. Around a third of adults in the UK have high blood pressure, although many will not realise it.

If you take your blood pressure, either by using the machine in reception at the surgery or a blood pressure monitor at home, you can submit and check your readings by going to the NHS link below and a chart will show you whether you are at risk and, if necessary, what action you should take.

Patients that have submitted a high Blood pressure reading within the past 12 months are being proactively contacted and any that are considered high will be passed to the care coordinator and they may be invited to participate in a 7-day monitoring programme.

All the local pharmacies are also offering this service. Please arrange to have your Blood pressure checked regularly as early detection of High or low Blood pressure could be easily be managed.
